NL EAST

GLEN ALLEN METS 17-11

The Mets stayed out in front in the division and actually increased their lead to 4 games. Tatis has led the team offensively by batting .316 with 16 homers and 44 RBI's. The pitching staff led by Erickson, Nagy and Ritchie leads the league in ERA at 4.06. Erickson has 8 victories and Nagy has chipped in with 7. Ritchie is 4th among ERA leaders with a sparkling 3.15 ERA. Hernandez has saved 12 games for the Mets and turned in an impressive 1.27 ERA.

RACINE HEAT 14-14
