NL East

Long Island (16-12) continues to lead the pack but not exactly tearing it up, playing at a .536 pace. Just 4 games over .500 but still a top the Eastern Division. No other team seems to be able to make a run at the Tigers. They did improve their record with 16 wins this month. At the end of last month they were setting at .500.

NL Central

Bloomington (21-7) after a slow start out of the gate the Bees are now stinging any opponent that gets in their way. They mowed there way through the AL East this month. In one month, they traveled from 2nd in the division, one game back from Columbus to gain a 7 game lead in the Central. The big 3 in the pitching staff, Martinez, Maddux and Clemens, finally turned it on. If they didn't have enough offense, here comes Jose Canseco with his 46 homers to help the team acquired from Gem City.

Stanley (18-10) had an impressive month. In 3rd place last month with only 11 wins, they jumped over Columbus to get into 2nd place. They also tore up the AL East foes this month. The Sioux are trying to put some heat on the Bees and at the very least make a run at a wildcard spot in the playoffs.
